Megan has a background in education and music, as both a primary school teacher/leader and music specialist. She completed her Masters degree in Choral Conducting through The University of Auckland, New Zealand. Megan is a practitioner of Kodály-inspired music education, and also an accredited lecturer, having undertaken her training through The Cuskelly College of Music, Australia. She is the face behind Kodály Aotearoa, supporting music teachers around the country and running accredited training courses.

Megan is the co-author of *Hear Our Voices*, a handbook for leaders of children's choirs. She is a national conducting mentor for the New Zealand Choral Federation and presents their *Singing Matters* workshops, targeting primary school song leaders.

Outside of mentoring teachers and facilitating professional development opportunities for educators around the country, Megan delivers classroom music programmes in schools and conducts a children's choir for Project Prima Volta in Napier.
